ORDINANCE OF THE TOWN OF BOLTON PROHIBITING THE USE OF
PERSONAL WATERCRAFT ON THE WATERS OF TROUT LAKE

ADOPTED: AUGUST 16, 1994
PUBLISHED: SEPTEMBER 24, 1994

SECTION 1: Definition: A personal watercraft (PWC) means a vessel which uses an inboard motor powering a waterjet pump as its primary source of motive power and which is designed to be operated by a person sitting, standing, or kneeling on, or being towed behind the vessel rather than in the conventional matter of sitting or standing inside the vessel. The term shall include jet skis, surf skis, fun skis, wave runners or other similar type of devices.

SECTION 2: Prohibition: It shall be unlawful at any time, for any person to operate a personal watercraft on the waters of Trout Lake located in the Town of Bolton, Warren County, New York.

SECTION 3: Penalties: A violation of this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an offense punishable by a fine not to exceed one hundred (\$100.00) dollars for each offense and imprisonment for a period not exceeding fifteen (15) days or by both such fine and imprisonment for a conviction of a first offense: by a fine of not less than two hundred and fifty (\$250.00) dollars or by imprisonment for a period not exceeding thirty (30) days or by both such fine and imprisonment for a conviction of a second offense committed within a period of eighteen months.

SECTION 4: Effective date: This ordinance shall take effect ten days after the publication thereof.
